What are they making?







They are making Rice-Pudding with Fruit Sauce

Ingredients for Rice-pudding:

2 cups of water

6 oz rice (preferable round)

4 1/2 cup whole milk

1 tbs butter or margarine

Salt and Sugar (optional)

Method:

Wash the rice and put it into the water. Cook slowly until water is almost absorbed, 10-15 minutes. Add the milk and cook slowly until rice is tender. Stir often to prevent burning. Add the butter and flavor the porridge with salt and sugar.

Ingredients for Fruit compote:

1 1/2 cups of dried fruit (apricots, peaches, prunes, or mixture of fruits)

2 1/2 - 3 cups of water

1-3 tbs of sugar

Method:

Soak fruit in water for several hours. Cook it 5 to 15 minutes in the same water after adding the sugar. Lift out the fruit and reduce the syrup and pour over the fruit.

Chef's Corner

Finally, the "Flying Jacob" makes a strong comeback!

A 1970's chicken dish with a much less unclear origins than the omnipresent Jansson's Temptation. And to the dismay by many chefs it went into obscurity. Do you remember the dish "Flygande Jacob" from the 1970's? It was a hugely popular dish to serve friends and families in Sweden back in the day. The name came from the originator of the dish, Ove Jacobsson (who worked in the air freight industry) and the recipe was first published in 1976.



Did you really forget my "Flying Jacob"?

Flying Jacob

Ingredients: for ca 8-10 people)

4 grilled chickens

4-5 bananas

1 1/3 cup heavy cream

1 cup chili sauce

200 g bacon

½ cup peanuts

Flygande Jacob

Ingredienser: för ca 8-10 gäster

4 grillade kycklingar

4-5 bananer

3,4 dl tjock grädde

1 dl chili sauce

200 g bacon

½ dl jordnötter

Instruction:

Preheat oven to 450 F.

Remove the bones from the chicken and put the chicken pieces in an oven-safe dish. Salt and pepper.

Peel the bananas and cut them first across and then lengthwise, so that you get four pieces out of each banana. Put the banana pieces on top of the chicken.

Beat the cream and mix with the chili sauce.

Spread the mixture on top of the chicken and banana. Bake in oven for 20 minutes.

Meanwhile, cut the bacon in smaller pieces and fry until crisp.

Put the bacon pieces and the peanuts on top of the baked chicken. Serve with rice and a salad.
