You can see that we have many activities planned, and the upcoming August 9 crayfish festival is an event you won't want to miss. *It is also time for your 2014 Membership Renewal!*


Report from The New Sweden Annual Meeting at Fogelbo

The annual meeting was held at Fogelbo where Ross and Carol opened the meeting by sharing the upcoming events for the year. The treasurer's report was reviewed as well. Ingeborg Dean made a presentation of interviews she made for SRIO book. To give you a sense of what you will find in the new book "*Swedish Roosts, Oregon Lives*", (www.swedishrootsinoregon.org) here are a few excerpts:

"I finally left Omaha and worked on the railroad for some time. After that I went to Wyoming because I took my sister up there when her husband was working there. He had moved there by himself. So that's why I ended up on a ranch in Wyoming. It was rugged. I had a cattle ranch, but I didn't have enough stock, and then the government told me I had to go into defense. There was a war on, after all. I don't know what I would have been if the government hadn't taken me out of that place. When I think about the winters... I had some tough winters there all alone, right on the Colorado border. In fact, the man at the station asked me where I worked, and when I said I had a ranch up there, he said, "You're on that ranch! It's too hard to get up there. The last man who had that ranch we hauled off dead. He froze to death."

"Well, you are looking at a Swede now!" I told him.

Portland Scandinavian Chorus is...Scandia Ladies' Chorus & Scandinavian Male Chorus of Portland, opening the 2014 season.

Since 1982, the chorus has been very active. The men's and women's choruses have hosted AUSS Western Division Conventions, and two AUSS National Conventions. The last one was in 2008. Three choruses from Sweden came to Portland and participated in the convention. There were about 350 singers on stage as 1,000 people filled the Portland Convention Center to hear the Grand Concert.

While preparing for the 2008 Convention, we decided to serve Swedish meatball meals to the workers of the committees. This insured attendance and participation. We also learned it was a very positive social time for the attendees. The group wanted to continue with a social time even after the convention was over. We began to serve a "Soup Supper" every second Monday of the month. At 6 PM we serve a choice of two soups, one is always a vegetarian entrée. There are always warm home baked bread choices, fresh salad, and delicious desserts. We encourage visitors to join us, eat, and if the can, stay and listen or participate in practice. Between 45 and 50 people attend this social time.

Although maintaining their separate identities, in 2010 the men's and women's choruses decided to sing as a mixed chorus. Vance Sele, was hired to be the director. Change and growth began to happen. Starting in 2011 we began to sing almost all our music in "languages." We started with Swedish and Norwegian. As we reached out in the Scandinavian community, we have added other Nordic languages. It is so exciting for us as a group to add native speakers from Denmark, Finland and Iceland. At Scanfair this year our native speakers introduced the Christmas songs from their countries. We are one of the few American Union of Swedish Singers (AUSS) choruses that sing primarily in the native languages of the Scandinavian countries. We are currently working on the national anthems of these countries. For the Individual Chorus night at the 2013 national convention in New Haven, CT, the Portland selections were comprised of *Lyssna, Lyssna*, and a lively medley of Swedish folk tunes. Working with Vance, (a self-proclaimed "hopeless music teacher") we are learning more about music. He leads creative vocal warm-ups, laughter filled sight-reading exercises. As our leader put it, "A group will grow when it grows musically." Our group is definitely growing both musically, and in numbers. Five years ago we had a core group of about 18 to 20 women, and an average of 6 men. Now there are between 30 and 35 women, and 14 to 17 men.

Traditional Swedish Smörgåsbord


Also known as “Smorgasbord” in English. Literally “open-sandwich” table.

Chef's

Corner

Smörgåsbord (smorgasbord) is a traditional Swedish “open-sandwich” buffet table consisting of cold and warm dishes presented so the guests are able to pick and chose what they want to eat.

Included in the smorgasbord are several varieties of pickled herring, which constitute the first plate enjoyed with cracker-bread and butter, and beer and snaps. Then follows a selection of cold cuts (meat, smoked salmon, eel, mackerel), fish in aspic, salads, and an assortment of cheeses. After all this there are warm dishes, such as gratins, meatballs, meat, poultry, and vegetables. Of course there are also an array of desserts and fruits. Coffee and tea are served with the dessert. Beer and snaps normally accompany the main meal.



The word "smorgas" (sandwich/smörgås) is reminiscent of a long gone era when the cottages churned their own butter. During the process the small butter lumps came up to the surface of the cream and floated around like geese. Such butter lumps were a good fit to put on a slice of bread (smörgås). The word "smorgasbord" is used in a figurative sense of a large and inviting choice of dishes.

It is also one of the few modern Swedish words borrowed into English. The “smorgasbord” is very much associated with holiday seasons or special events, such as: Christmas, Easter, Midsummer, Crayfish Party (Kräftskiva), or whenever Swedes feel a strong urge to celebrate. As you can understand, it takes a big crowd of hungry people to enjoy a feast like this.
