# Potato Salad with Herbs

# A classical Nordic summer evening meal

Chef's

Corner

#### Potatis sallad med örtkryddor:

Vad känns bättrre än färsk potatis sallad vid den här årstiden? Perfekt för picknicks eller somtillbehör till grillad mat.

Receptet är för 8 personer.

#### Ingredienser för salladen:

1 1/2 kg färskpotatis, kokt och tärnad

6 vårlökar, hackade

1 knippe rädisor, skivade

#### Ingredienser till salladsdressingen:

2 matskedar balsamisk vinäger

4 matskedar vegetabilisk matolja

1 tesked Dijon-typ senap

1 riven vitlöksklyfta

120 gram färska kryddor (hackad basilika, dill, körvel) Salt and Pepper efter smak

#### Instruktion:

- 1. Blanda kokta potatis tärningar, vårlökarna och rädisorna i en skål.
- 2. I en mindre skål blanda vinäger, matolja, senap och vitlöken. Rör ihop kryddorna och tillsätt salt och peppar efter smak.
- 3. Addera försiktigt dressingen till potatis blandningen. Ställ blandningen i kylskåpet tills den är kall. Garnera med körvel.

#### Potato salad with herbs:

What's better than a fresh potato salad this time of the year? Perfect for picnics and as a sidedish at barbecues.

This recipe is serving 8,

#### Ingredients for the salad:

31/2 lbs new potatoes, boiled and quartered

6 scallions, chopped

1 bunch radishes, sliced

#### Ingredients for the dressing:

- 2 Tablespoon white balsamic vinegar
- 4 Tablespoon vegetable oil
- 1 teaspoon Dijon-type mustard
- 1 garlic clove, grated
- 4 oz fresh herbs (chopped basil, dill, chervil) salt and pepper

#### Instruction

- 1.Mix boiled and quartered potatoes, scallions and radishes in a bowl.
- 2. In a smaller bowl mix vinegar, oil, mustard and garlic. Stir in the herbs and add salt and pepper to taste.
- 3. Carefully add the dressing to the potato mix. Put in fridge until cool. Garnish with chervil.

# The Romance of a Nordic Summer Evening

"Nordic summer's evening" has become a symbolic painting for the so called "Nordic light" paintings, a theme for many Scandinavian painters. It is seen as a romantic mood painting with some symbolism embedded in it. The interpretations are many; e.g. the sexual tension between a man and a woman, and the human connection to nature.

The painting depicts the view from the balcony on "Ekholmsnäs", on the island of Lidingö in Stockholm.



The two models were painted on different occasions; Prince Eugen was painted there on the balcony, while the singer Karin Pyk was painted in Assisi, Italy.

# Non - Profit Status, by Carol Tripp

The application to the IRS for New Sweden to become designated as a tax-exempt organization has been mailed. The processing time takes from two months up to a year. In 2010 the IRS implemented strict restrictions and classifications for non-profit organizations to be determined a 501(c)(3) tax-exempt organization. A classification of 501(c)(7) applies to what the IRS calls a social organization that has no educational nor public benefit status. This designation allows the organization to be tax exempt, but contributions are not tax exempt to the contributor. To clarify New Sweden's qualifying for



a 501(c)(3) required several months of research and coordination with the attorney. All ten NSCHS board members approved including a Conflict of Interest section in our application. All Board members received an electronic copy of the package, and a paper copy will be mailed to the Board president. We'll keep the membership informed as this process moves along.
