History of New Sweden's Scandinavian Christmas Goat Market

Before the pandemic, New Sweden relied heavily on vending a variety of wares at Nordic events and hosting an annual "yard sale" featuring donated Scandinavian items. This yard sale required significant volunteer hours over many days with most of the earnings generously donated to Trollbacken Swedish Camp and the Swedish School. However, with Nordic Northwest gaining ownership and control of the Fogelbo grounds, that opportunity vanished. The onset of COVID-19 brought restrictions that limited the number of people at gatherings, forcing NNW to reduce the size of Scan Fair and the number of vendors.

In the fall of 2021, as restrictions eased, Jane Adams from Sons of Norway, New Sweden President Corina Laws, and New Sweden Facebook administrator Courtnee Riise Averskog came up with the idea of hosting a small Christmas market at Portland's Grieg Lodge Sons of Norway Norse Hall. The goal was to have just enough vendors to cover the facility rental cost. Corina presented a financial plan to the New Sweden Board and they agreed to the initial outlay, with New Sweden receiving the profits from admissions. Inspired by a vintage Swedish Christmas card featuring a cartoon pig, the market was named "The Christmas Pig Market," which certainly caught people's attention, especially given that the market was just six weeks away.

Jane, Courtnee, and Corina handled all the organizing, planning, publicity, and vendor coordination. On December 11th, the group anxiously awaited to see if anyone would attend. With about twenty vendors and nominal adult admission, the event turned out to be a success. After months of being homebound, people were excited to have the opportunity to go out. The beauty of the Norse Hall ballroom, adorned with draping Nordic flags and a serene Christmas tree aglow with hundreds of clear lights provided a much-needed respite from months of isolation.

New Sweden saw a fund-raising potential and inquired about the plans the three women had for the 2022 market. None of them were in a position in their personal lives to do the work to produce another market. So, they agreed that New Sweden could continue the market, but using a different name. Building on the original name, New Sweden's Scandinavian Christmas Goat Market was created recognizing the Julbock.

Over the past three years, the Goat Market has grown significantly. In the first year, hot food vendors were added in the lower floor dining room. In the second year, space was rented on the second floor Lodge Room for displays, activities, and additional vendors. By the third year, the lower floor Nordic Room was rented to add extra seating and vendor space. We have now reached the maximum growth capacity in the building. The planning group has worked hard to ensure another successful event, and they look forward to a festive and fun 2025 Scandinavian Christmas Goat Market!







Fall Cookie Baking Event

New Sweden member, Jamie Stone Runckel, taught the fall cookie baking class on October 12. He arrived with not one, but two sweet bread braids- cardamom and cardamom & cinnamon for class members to enjoy with coffee, even before the class began. They were delicious!

Jamie shared his techniques on creating Hallongrottor (Swedish Raspberry Caves), Milanopinnar (Swedish "Milanese" Logs), and Chokladsnittar (Swedish Chocolate Slices). He demonstrated how he makes each cookie look perfect. Attendees left with recipes and a container of cookies to enjoy later. A huge THANK YOU to Jamie for teaching this fun class and sharing his baking expertise.

Jamie is the owner/operator of Jamie's Kafferep, a boutique business specializing in Swedish and German baked goods. You will find him at major Nordic events like Midsummer, Scandinavian Christmas Goat Market, and Scan Fair, as well as



the Hillsdale Farmer's Market the first four Sundays in November, and December 7th and 21st. Jamie suggests making the order in advance to ensure he has the desired baked goods on hand. 

Exhibit: Swedish Cabins: Legacy of Henry Steiner and Fogelbo

The Oregon State Capitol will host the exhibit – Swedish Cabins: The Legacy of Henry Steiner and Fogelbo. It is scheduled to be on display at the Oregon State Capitol from **January 6**, **2026**, **to February 5**, **2026**. The exhibit is presented by Nordic Northwest and will be located in the Capitol's West Galleria. The exhibit is available during Capitol hours, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday.

For most Americans, the log cabin represents the American frontier. The log cabin also tells the story of Swedish immigration and innovation in the United States. In the Pacific Northwest, the story of the Swedish log cabin lives on through the legacy of craftsman, Henry Steiner. In the 1920s through the 1950s, Steiner and his family built around a hundred cabins and other structures.



On the campus of Nordic Northwest is Fogelbo. A National Historic Site, Fogelbo is an outstanding example of the craftsmanship and style of Henry Steiner.

This exhibit was one of three that were awarded Capitol History Gateway exhibit sponsorships in the first year of the program. Exhibits are funded, in part, by the Oregon State Capitol Foundation, a 501(c)3 non-profit organization.


Congratulations to Harmoni Lodge!

Meet Max Martin – Sweden's Supreme Hitmaker

Known as a mega hit machine, Max Martin is a highly successful Swedish songwriter and producer for some of the biggest pop artists in the world over the past 25 years. He has written or co-written 30 Billboard Hot 100 number-one singles and produced or co-produced 26 of them. This is the most #1s for any producer in the history of the Billboard Hot 100 chart. Most recently Max Martin and his Swedish collaborator Shellback teamed up with superstar Taylor Swift as the sole collaborators on her 12th album, *The Life of a Showgirl* at his studio outside of Stockholm. The Billboard Hot 100 record was achieved with the success of the recent hit from the album, "The Fate of Ophelia," becoming his 26th No.1 as a producer.



His extensive discography also includes hits for artists like Britney Spears, Backstreet Boys, Katy Perry, Kelly Clarkson, Justin Timberlake and The Weekend. The trio previously worked together on several Taylor Swift hit songs such as, "Shake It Off," "I Knew You Were Trouble," "Blank Space," and "We Are Never Ever Getting Back Together."
